The Opportunity

The College and Graduate School of Arts & Sciences at the University of Virginia seeks an eminent scholar for the William L. Polk Jr. and Carolyn K. Polk Jefferson Scholars Foundation Distinguished University Professorship in Artificial Intelligence and Democratic Futures. This position will draw on UVa's long-standing intellectual leadership in the study of democracy while contributing to emergent expertise in Al.

We seek a scholar whose work addresses the implications of Al for democratic institutions and/or employs the tools of Al and machine learning to enhance understanding of democratic processes and practices. Relevant expertise might include the regulation and governance of Al in media; investigative and data-based journalism on Al; misinformation and disinformation; the use of Al in the design of democratic institutions (e.g. redistricting plans) or judicial processes. Most broadly, our goal is to identify a superlative scholar whose research and teaching engage the roles of responsible Al in shaping knowledge acquisition, civic engagement, and democratic participation, with an understanding of both the promise and the limitations of Al. We particularly encourage applications from scholars whose disciplinary areas include one or more of the following: Economics, Media Studies, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, and Statistics. Salary will be competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.

UVA AI Initiatives

Al-related research is taking place in all twelve of UVA's schools. To support researchers, practitioners, and students working within and beyond disciplinary boundaries, the University has established a collaborative and dynamic network of labs, initiatives, and institutes engaged in cutting edge work related to Al. This network includes the Al-Powered Astronomy Institute, the LaCross Institute for Ethical Artificial Intelligence in Business, the Digital Technology for Democracy Lab, and the Biocomplexity Institute and Initiative.

The University has also accelerated its hiring in Al. This year, the Provost's office announced the allocation of 10 new endowed chairs for strategic hiring in Artificial Intelligence. Several of these new hires will be housed in Arts & Sciences.

Responsibilities

University professorships hold the rank of professor and are typically reserved for faculty engaged in research and teaching that crosses school boundaries. University professors are eminent in their respective disciplines, hold the same or higher qualifications of any faculty holding an endowed professorship, and are held in the highest regard by their national and international academic peers. University professors also hold appointments as professors in department(s) and school(s) and may retain any (other) endowed professorships they may hold in addition to the title of University professor.

Jefferson Fellowships are designed to identify Ph.D. and M.B.A. candidates who demonstrate outstanding achievement and the highest promise as scholars, teachers, public servants, and business leaders in the United States and beyond. Once selected, Jefferson Fellows are charged with furthering the quality of education, intellectual life, and mission of the University through their academic pursuits and community engagement.

At the undergraduate level, the Jefferson Scholars Foundation is committed to developing leaders, scholars, and citizens for the benefit of the University and the world at-large. The

Jefferson Scholars Program and the Walentas Scholars Program cultivate outstanding undergraduate students, providing them with financial support to pursue their passions, develop their talents, and encourage their community involvement. Both programs provide generous financial packages, enrichment opportunities, and access to the JSF network of Scholars, Fellows, alumni, and volunteers.

Chairholders are nationally and internationally recognized scholars and leaders who demonstrate a strong commitment to teaching. They are leading-edge researchers in their fields as well as superior classroom teachers who are eager to engage with students. They are active and engaged citizens of the University community whose presence on the faculty help attract other outstanding colleagues to UVa. Holders of Jefferson Scholars Foundation Chairs are expected to participate actively in the Jefferson Scholar Foundation's community by serving on Foundation selection committees, attending Foundation events, and helping the Foundation recruit Scholars and Fellows.



Qualifications

The holder of an endowed chair is receiving one of the most prestigious honors that can be bestowed on a University of Virginia faculty member. The highest levels of performance, and national and international recognition of that performance, are inherent guidelines for appointment of a chair holder. The institutional expectation of unquestionable excellence means that the person is deemed to have achieved the highest stature and exemplary accomplishment in a discipline or area of research as judged by an independent assessment of his or her peers. In certain instances, accomplishment may be judged on the basis of distinguished work for which there is peer consensus of superior achievement whether in teaching, service or in accomplishments which lie beyond strictly academic endeavors. Excellence should be evidenced by several years of outstanding performance based on national and international standards.

Faculty selected for each Professorship must meet the University's minimum criteria for an eminent scholar professorship. In addition, the University will attempt to identify candidates who meet the following criteria desired by the Foundation and its benefactors:

- National and international recognition as scholar and leader;
- Demonstrated excellence as a teacher:
- Strong commitment to interdisciplinary collaborations; and
- Willingness to participate actively in the Foundation's community.

The largest of UVA's 12 schools, A&S offers more than 50 undergraduate degrees and concentrations and 29 graduate degree programs. It educates 70% of all of the University's undergraduate students (conferring upwards of 2,500 degrees each year), trains nearly half of all doctoral students, appoints 60% of the tenure–track faculty, and houses the core disciplines upon which UVA's academic reputation is built.
